MEETING MINUTES

Important Notice Regarding COVID 19

In the interest of maintaining appropriate social distancing measures, members of the public were able to participate in the meeting electronically via GoToMeeting and had the right to observe and offer public comment during the meeting.

4. Approve Minutes

5. Website Development Agreement with Jigsaw Analytics Group, Inc. - Stacie Morales

Action: Authorize the CEO of MOVE to negotiate and take any steps required to execute any and all documents necessary to execute a Website Development Agreement between Jigsaw Analytics Group Incorporated and MOVE Stanislaus Transportation.

Discussion: Stacie Morales presented the need for a new website. As MOVE services continue to grow and accessible technology improves now is the time to develop a website that will better serve our clients. The MOVE Board of Directors approved budget for fiscal year 2021/22 included funding for a new website. Jigsaw Analytics Group, Inc. (Jigsaw) is MOVE's software developer and has a website division within their organization. Utilizing the same company allows MOVE to integrate features from our software into our website.

David Gonzales and Aaron Truax from Jigsaw shared their experience in developing websites for non-profit and transit agencies. The new website will provide the following features:

- Adjust font and contrast for visually impaired
- Voice command to search site
- Chat bot allows the visitor to ask questions like "Am I eligible?" or "How can I volunteer?", it will direct them to information on the site to answer their questions, or it can be designed to notify a staff member, who can then be involved in assisting the client
- Calendar for upcoming community events will allow the clients to add to their google calendar as a reminder
- Website can be converted to several languages with one click
- Integrate information directly from the website into MOVE's internal database, which will significantly decrease staff time of taking information then re-entering into the database



- Staff will have the ability to update website. This provides a substantial cost savings
- Google Grant program, which as a nonprofit MOVE qualifies for, offers \$10,000.00 per month of free Google advertising which can be directed to people in Stanislaus County to drive them to the website

The website will be completed by March 2022.

Director Aguilera asked, "How do the seniors know how to maneuver the website?" Stacie explained the website will be user friendly and tested with agencies such as VIPS (Vision Impaired Persons Service) to test the website features. For those not comfortable utilizing websites, MOVE staff will always be available to assist.

Motion made by Director Maisetti, Second by Director Aguilera to authorize the CEO of MOVE to negotiate and take any steps required to execute any and all documents necessary to execute a Website Development Agreement between Jigsaw Analytics Group Incorporated and MOVE Stanislaus Transportation. Passed: Unanimous

6. CEO Report – Stacie Morales

<u>Human Services Coordination Plan</u> – The team is developing the workshops to prioritize the identified gaps during the survey and stakeholder meetings. The prioritization workshops will be held virtually in September. The workshop details will be sent out to all MOVE Board members.

<u>Legal Service Update</u> – We currently have a contract with Neumiller and Beardslee which is the firm where Monica Streeter was working prior to being hired on by Stanislaus Council of Governments (StanCOG). I met with attorney Rod Attebery. He currently works with San Joaquin County Council of Governments and is very familiar with transportation and the different funding sources. This firm is qualified to continue providing legal counsel for MOVE.

<u>Local Initiative Support Corporation (LISC)</u> – Uber currently offers free rides to vaccine sites. Many people do not have the technology or ability to schedule their free rides for Uber. LISC, has awarded MOVE a \$9,200 grant which is available to use until March of 2022. MOVE will assist any residents of Stanislaus County with scheduling free rides using the Uber Health App. LISC has identified there are a lack of drivers available in the Westside area. Catholic Charities will attempt to recruit volunteers to provide the rides.

Director Maisetti mentioned she knows of many people who have only gotten their first shot and are not fully vaccinated. Stacie explained that Catholic Charities can use



assistance in locating volunteer drivers. Director Maisetti is from Patterson and may be able to assist.

<u>In-person Board Meetings</u> – Due to the pandemic we will continuing with "hybrid" board meetings. Meetings may be attended virtually or in-person until further notice.

7. Comments by Rosa De León Park, Ex-Officio

Edith Robles from StanCOG attended on behalf of Rosa De León Park. Ms. Robles reiterated that extensive outreach was done for the Human Services Coordination Plan, and will now be moving forward to phase two, which will identify where the gaps are and how to meet those needs. A presentation will be given to both StanCOG and the MOVE Boards next month. We appreciate the teamwork from MOVE on this project as it has required an extensive amount of outreach. During the month of July public transit is free in the county, so we encourage folks to go out and use it. We are still holding virtual meetings but expect to have an update around the end of August.

<u>Discussion:</u>

February 2016, an ADA Paratransit Eligibility Study was completed with the cooperation and support of the Stanislaus Council of Governments (StanCOG), Modesto Area Dial-A-Ride (MADAR), Stanislaus Regional Transit (StaRT), Dial-A-Ride of Turlock (DART), and Ceres Dial-A-Ride (CDAR), to examine the policies, procedures, and outcomes of paratransit eligibility programs currently in place within Stanislaus County.

In February 2018, the four transit operators in Stanislaus County (CAT, MAX, StaRT, and Turlock Transit) agreed to simplify and standardize the ADA eligibility process in Stanislaus County by designating MOVE Stanislaus Transportation, Inc. (MOVE) as the sole agency for determining ADA eligibility for all four systems. Instead of a paper-based application process, applicants would be provided free transportation (roundtrip) for an in-person assessment in their community. Eligible individuals would be kept in a centralized database and shared with each operator for the purpose of verifying eligibility when scheduling reservations.

MOVE has successfully been providing the requested services since March 2018. These services are funded by MOVE's Transportation Development Act (TDA) funds, which are transit funds apportioned to various agencies that provide transit-related services.

The City of Modesto and County of Stanislaus voted on January 26, 2021, to create the Stanislaus Regional Transit Authority (StanRTA) and transfer public transit functions to StanRTA, effective July 1, 2021. Due to the creation of StanRTA it is necessary to enter into a service agreement with this new agency.

Fiscal Impact:

MOVE has been providing the ADA Paratransit Eligibility for the transit agencies since March 2018. The \$186,290 expenses for this program have been included in the MOVE Board Fiscal year 2021/22 budget which was approved by the MOVE Board of Directors on March 30th, 2021.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Directors:

Authorize the CEO of MOVE to negotiate and take any steps required to execute any



and all documents necessary to enter into a Service Agreement with StanRTA to provide ADA Paratransit Eligibility Services.

SERVICES AGREEMENT

between

MOVE STANISLAUS TRANSPORTATION, INC.

and

STANISLAUS REGIONAL TRANSIT AUTHORITY

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of September 23, 2021, by and between MOVE Stanislaus Transportation, Inc., a California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation, hereinafter referred to as "MOVE," and Stanislaus Regional Transit Authority, a California joint powers agency, hereinafter referred to as "AUTHORITY".

<u>WITNESSETH</u>

WHEREAS, the Americans with Disabilities Act ("ADA") requires public transit operators that provide fixed-route service to provide complementary paratransit service to people with disabilities who cannot use the fixed-route service because of a disability; and

WHEREAS, the ADA regulations provide three categories of paratransit eligibility and the eligibility determination process for ADA complementary paratransit is developed by the transit system in consultation with the local community; and

WHEREAS, an ADA Paratransit Eligibility Study for Stanislaus County was completed in February 2016; and

WHEREAS, the four transit operators in Stanislaus County (City of Modesto/MAX, City of Turlock/Turlock Transit, City of Ceres/CAT, Stanislaus County/StaRT) agreed to implement a county-wide in-person model for ADA eligibility determination through an agreement with MOVE in February 2020; and

WHEREAS, the City of Modesto and County of Stanislaus voted on January 26, 2021, to create the Stanislaus Regional Transit Authority and transfer public transit functions to the Authority, effective July 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the City of Ceres/CAT ceased operation of transit services on June 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the eligibility center in Stanislaus County, referred to hereinafter as the "Stanislaus Eligibility Center", will be operated by MOVE as the designated Consolidated Transportation Services Agency ("CTSA") as designated by the Stanislaus Council of Governments ("StanCOG"); and

WHEREAS, StanCOG administers and distributes Transportation Development Act (TDA) funds;

WHEREAS, MOVE is eligible to claim TDA funds to fund the Stanislaus Eligibility Center; and

WHEREAS, MOVE and AUTHORITY enter into this Agreement, effective September 23, 2021, to document the terms and conditions of use and access to the Stanislaus Eligibility Center and the provision of complementary paratransit services.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, terms, and conditions hereinafter contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this Agreement is to set forth the structure for cooperative planning between MOVE and AUTHORITY or the purpose of identifying those individuals who meet the ADA criteria for eligibility for complementary paratransit services in Stanislaus County. All services provided pursuant to this Agreement shall comply with Part 37 of Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

2. <u>Term.</u> Upon execution, this Agreement shall remain in effect until modified by written agreement of both parties, or until such time as TDA or other funding sources are no longer available for operation of the Stanislaus Eligibility Center and provision of related services.

3. <u>Stanislaus Eligibility Center</u>.

A. The Stanislaus Eligibility Center will be operated and funded by MOVE, with TDA funds, and will implement the process for determining ADA paratransit eligibility on behalf of the transit operators within Stanislaus County.

B. ADA paratransit eligibility will be determined "in-person" which means that each individual requesting an eligibility determination must personally appear at the Stanislaus Eligibility Center, or other locations, mutually approved by AUTHORITY and MOVE. With approval of StanRTA CEO, The SEC may opt to modify the process during times of pandemic or disaster.

C. AUTHORITY and transit operations agents or contractors, as may be designated by AUTHORITY, will have access to eligibility determinations for individuals who have participated in the eligibility process.

D. All eligibility determinations prepared by MOVE shall be provided to the applicants in writing. Recipients of a determination other than unconditional will be informed of their right to appeal the determination.

4. <u>Obligations of AUTHORITY</u>.

A. AUTHORITY shall be responsible for meeting ADA transportation service requirements for individuals with disabilities once an ADA eligibility determination has been made. AUTHORITY will be responsible for establishing a mechanism for assigning

transportation to and from the Stanislaus Eligibility Center or designated assessment center located within AUTHORITY transit service area for in-person evaluations. The cost of such transportation within AUTHORITY transit service area shall be the sole responsibility of AUTHORITY.

B. AUTHORITY shall, at its own expense, procure and maintain in effect at all times during this Agreement, insurance coverage for the operation of and provision of its transportation services.

5. <u>Obligations of MOVE</u>.

A. MOVE shall file a TDA claim with StanCOG annually to secure funding for each fiscal year for operation of the Stanislaus Eligibility Center. If any TDA claim filed by MOVE is not approved and other funding is not secured, MOVE shall have no further obligations under this Agreement beyond the fiscal year for which funding has been secured.

B. MOVE shall provide in-person ADA paratransit eligibility determination services for AUTHORITY in accordance with all federal requirements.

C. MOVE shall prepare monthly reports identifying the number of eligibility interviews conducted and determinations made for AUTHORITY and the other transportation providers in Stanislaus County. Reports will be provided to AUTHORITY and to StanCOG.

6. <u>Termination</u>. Either party may terminate this Agreement, upon sixty (60) calendar days' written notice to the other party. All services provided by MOVE shall cease upon the effective date of termination provided pursuant to this paragraph.

7. <u>Status of the Parties</u>. It is understood by both AUTHORITY and MOVE that this Agreement shall not, under any circumstances, be construed or considered to create an employer-employee relationship or a joint venture.

8. <u>Defense and Indemnification</u>.

A. To the extent permitted by law, AUTHORITY shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend MOVE and its officers, employees, agents, representatives, or subcontractors from and against all claims, damages, losses, judgments, liabilities, expenses, and other costs, including litigation costs and attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting from any negligence or wrongful acts of AUTHORITY and its officers, or employees in the performance of this Agreement.

B. AUTHORITY's obligation to defend, indemnify, and hold MOVE, its agents, officers, and employees harmless under the provisions of this paragraph is not limited to or restricted by any requirements in this Agreement for AUTHORITY to procure and maintain a policy of insurance.

C. To the extent permitted by law, MOVE shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend AUTHORITY and its officers, employees, agents, representatives, or subcontractors

from and against all claims, damages, losses, judgments, liabilities, expenses, and other costs, including litigation costs and attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting from any negligence or wrongful acts of MOVE and its officers, or employees in the performance of this Agreement.

9. <u>MOVE Property</u>. All eligibility determinations, data, reports, surveys, studies, and other documents and materials prepared by MOVE pursuant to this Agreement shall be retained by MOVE during the term of this Agreement and at the completion or termination of this Agreement in accordance with Section 12, below. AUTHORITY may, at any time during the term of the Agreement or upon termination of the Agreement, request, at sole cost and expense, any documents or data referenced in this Section, in either physical or electronic form.

10. <u>Copyrights.</u> MOVE shall be free to copyright material developed under this Agreement with the provision that MOVE and the funding agencies reserve a royalty-free non-exclusive and irrevocable right to reproduce, publish or otherwise use, and to authorize others to use, the material for government or public purposes. MOVE and the funding sources shall be credited on all materials developed under this contract.

11. <u>Assignment.</u> Neither party shall assign or subcontract this Agreement, or any part thereof without prior written consent of the other party, and any attempt shall be void and unenforceable.

12. <u>Records and Audit</u>. MOVE shall retain and maintain all writings, documents, and records prepared in connection with the performance of this Agreement for a minimum of four (4) years from the termination or completion of the Agreement or other period required by law. This includes any handwriting, typewriting, printing, photocopying, photographing, and every other means of recording upon any tangible thing, any form of communication or representation including letters, words, pictures, sounds, or symbols or any combination thereof.

13. <u>Resolution of Conflict</u>. All questions pertaining to the validity and interpretation of this Agreement shall be determined in accordance with the laws of the State of California applicable to agreements made and to be performed within the State. Any dispute not resolved by informal arbitration between the parties to this agreement may be adjudicated in a court of law under the laws of the State of California.

14. <u>Severability</u>. If any portion of this Agreement or application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction or if it is found in contravention of any Federal, State, or local statutes, ordinances, or regulations the remaining provisions of this Agreement or the application thereof shall not be invalidated thereby and shall remain in full force and effect to the extent that the provisions of this Agreement are severable.

15. <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement may be modified, amended, changed, added to, or subtracted from by the mutual consent of the parties hereto if such amendment or change is in written form and executed with the same formalities as this Agreement and attached to the original Agreement to maintain continuity.

16. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice, communication, amendments, additions, or deletions to this Agreement including change of address of either party during the term of this Agreement which

AUTHORITY or MOVE shall be required or may desire to make, shall be in writing and may be personally served, faxed, or sent by prepaid first-class mail to the respective parties as follows:

17. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement contains the entire Agreement of the parties and no representations, inducements, promises, or agreements otherwise between the parties not embodied herein or incorporated herein by reference shall be of any force or effect. Further, no term or provision hereof may be changed, waived, discharged, or terminated unless the same is in writing executed by the parties hereto. AUTHORITY and MOVE represent that, in entering this Agreement, they have not relied on any previous representations, inducements, or understandings of any kind or nature.

18. <u>Benefit of Agreement</u>. This Agreement shall bind and benefit the parties hereto and their heirs, successors, and permitted assigns.
